WHAT IS CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING (CPL)?

Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) is a process of evaluating your learning and awarding college credit based on the demonstration of college-level learning gained through experience.

Western Technical College evaluates learning based on course competencies and through various methods of CPL assessment, you can save you time and money because you may not be required to take courses that you can show satisfactory college-level learning. CPL is awarded only for **learning** and not for **experience**.



SIX METHODS FOR AWARDING CPL:

You can earn credit through one of these six methods below or a combination.

1. STANDARD EXAMS:

Standardized exams are written by professional testing companies or private universities and are administered in licensed testing sites. Currently, Western accepts:

- College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)
- DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST)
- Advanced Placement (AP) exams

2. INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGE EXAMS:

Challenge exams are written by Western Technical College faculty specifically for its students. The exams are equivalent to the comprehensive final exam and maybe written, oral, demonstration or a combination of all three.

3. MILITARY TRAINING AND SERVICE:

Veterans and service members can earn credit for military training and service through an evaluation of your Joint Service Transcript (JST). Certain military courses and occupational exhibits along with their ACE credit recommendations have been established for specific courses at Western Technical College.

In addition to a JST review, Western Technical College has a Military CPL Agreement based on years of service. Qualifying veterans can earn up to 10 credits in General Studies coursework.

4. WORKFORCE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATIONS:

Workforce training and national certifications that have been developed to meet industry/professional standards and evaluated by The American Council on Education (ACE) or other nationally recognized organizations can earn you credit.

5. PORTFOLIO ASSESSMENT:

A portfolio documents the college-level learning you've gained through work and other experiences. It validates your knowledge and skills that meet the competencies for the course(s) you are pursuing for credit. Various methods to demonstrate college-level learning include:

- Resume, autobiography
- Written narrative/reflection
- Performance evaluations
- Professional development plans
- Letters of recommendation, awards
- Testimony
- Examples of product, artwork, blueprints, models
- Newspaper/magazine clippings
- Military transcripts, training, and certifications
- Published books/articles
- Licenses/certifications
- Speeches or audio-visual presentations (live/video-taped)
- Demonstration (live/video-taped)
- Business plan, project management plan, management reports, budgets
- Research report, concept map
- Discussion/interview

6. CREDIT TRANSFER:

Students who have earned credits from other educational institutions can request Credit Transfer which can help you save time and money. Credit Transfer from another regionally accredited college, technical college, high school transcripted credit, or university maybe awarded for course work when earning a "C" or higher.
